

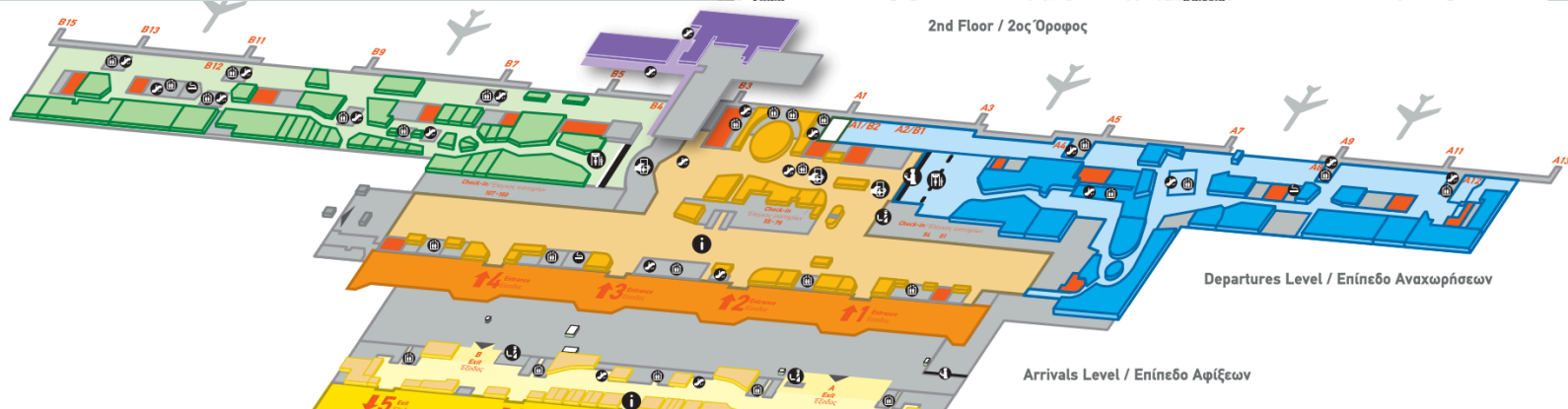


# Cruising from Athens

## Flying in

### Athens International Airport.

Located just over an hour to the east of the cruise port, Athens International Airport is the primary airport used for cruises departing Athens and just under 45 minutes from central Athens. For Hotels we recommend staying in the Plaka neighborhood in Athens near the Acropolis.



### Taxis

- Pick up – outside Baggage Claim/Arrivals Level, Exit 3
- Approximate Fares:
  - 40€ Airport to Athens city center inner ring
  - 65€ Airport to Piraeus Harbor

### Rental Cars

- Located in main arrivals terminal.
- Rental Car Operators available:
  - Enterprise, Avis
  - Hertz, Sixt
  - Europcar, Avance

### Bus

X96 Bus is usually the cheapest way to get to the port  
 To get to both of them you will leave through Door 4 or 5  
 This bus departs every 15-30 minutes and runs 24 hours  
 Approximately 10€

# Piraeus Harbor Terminals

Piraeus features three terminals with a total of 11 berths. All of the cruise lines share these three terminals. Ships above a certain size are limited to terminal B



## Terminal A - Miaoulis

Miaoulis is the main terminal at Piraeus. Can operate two ships with up to 2000 passengers simultaneously. It is less than 50 meters away from the berths with shuttle buses available for the further berths.



## Terminal B - Themistocles

Themistocles has two berths and is set up to service mega cruise ships. Parking on site with shuttles available at a cost. Terminal is 50 meters away from the primary berth with shuttles for the further one.



## Terminal C - Alkimos

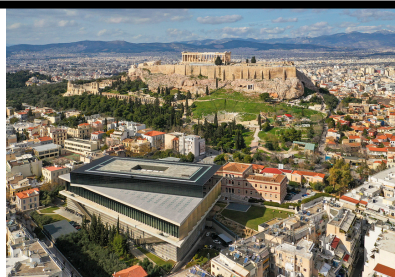
Alkimos serves primarily as overflow and has shuttles to transport passengers between berths and the terminal.
