

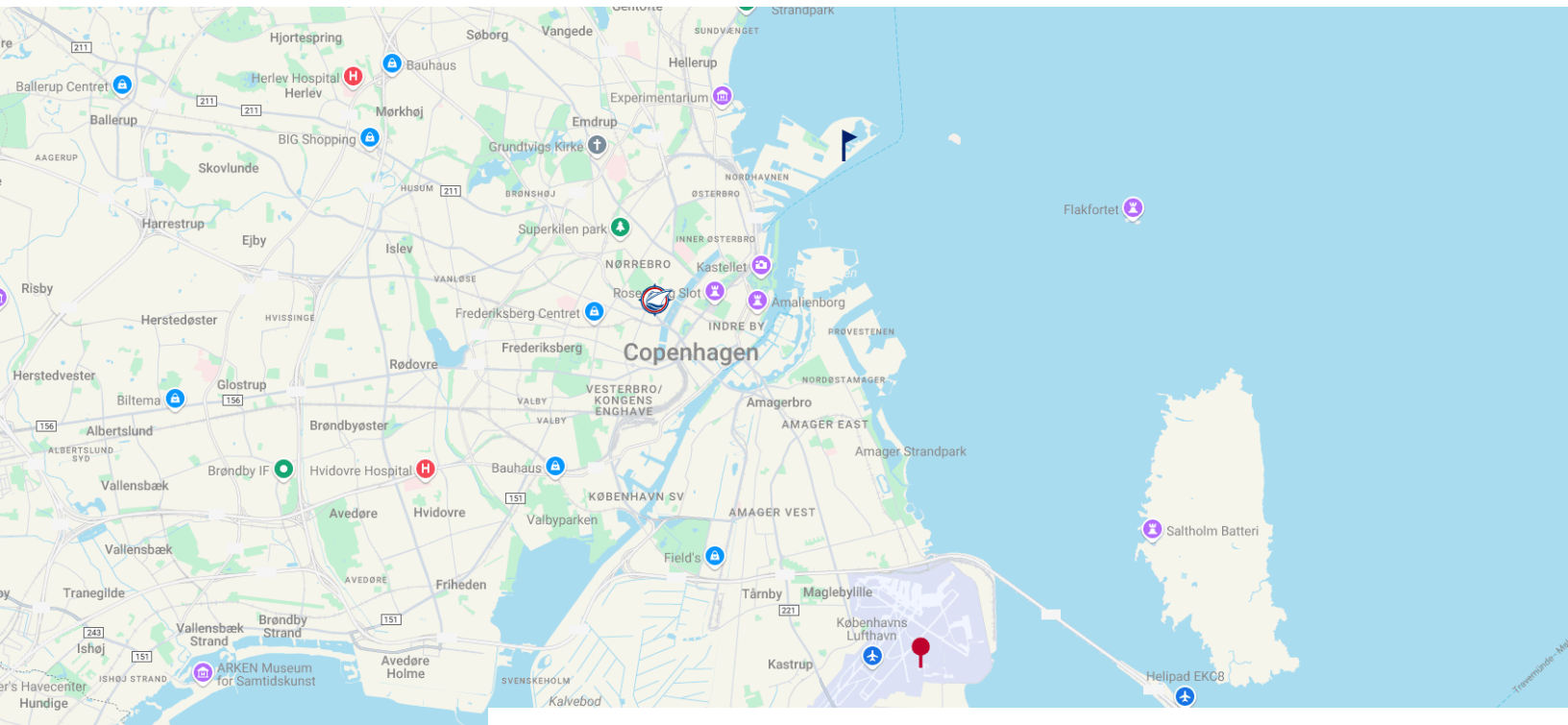


Cruising from Copenhagen

Flying in

Copenhagen Airport.

Located just 5 miles south of Copenhagen city center, Copenhagen Airport (CPH) is the main international gateway for cruise passengers. The airport is well-connected to both the city center and cruise port via efficient public transportation. For Hotels we recommend staying in the city center near Nyhavn or Tivoli Gardens.



Find Your Ride.

Taxis

Pick up - outside Terminal 3

Approximate Fares:

250-300 DKK (\$43 USD) to city center

300-350 DKK (\$51 USD) to cruise terminal

Metro & Train

Located at Terminal 3

Metro runs every 4-6 minutes

Train every 10 minutes

Journey time: 15 minutes to city

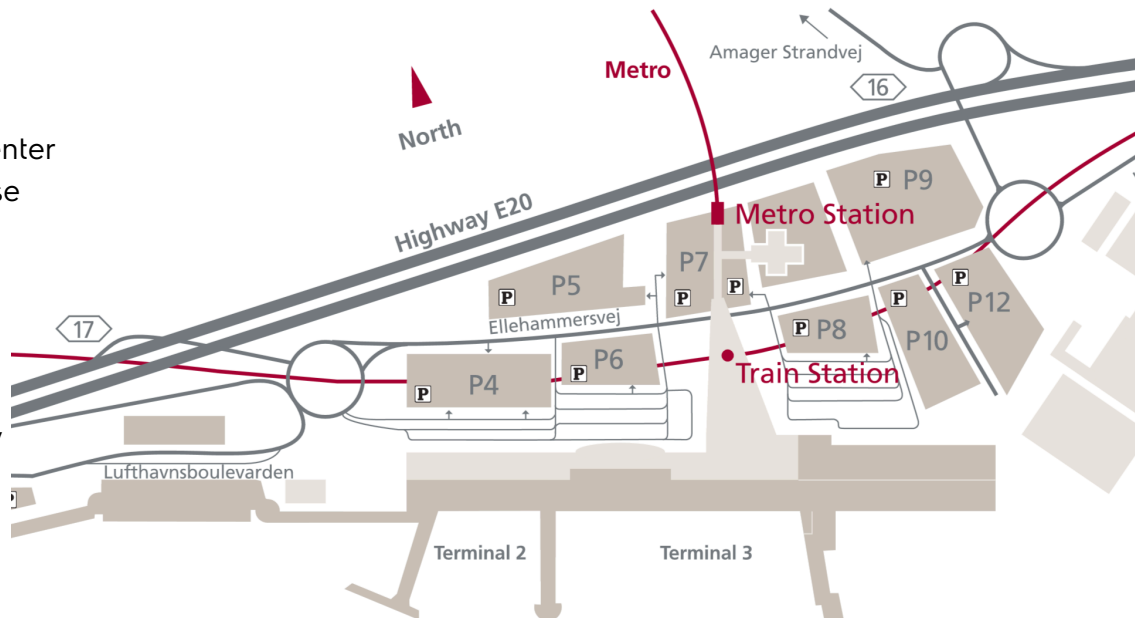
Bus

Bus 5C runs to city center

Departs every 10 minutes

Journey time: 30-35 minutes

Approximately 36 DKK (\$5.5 USD)



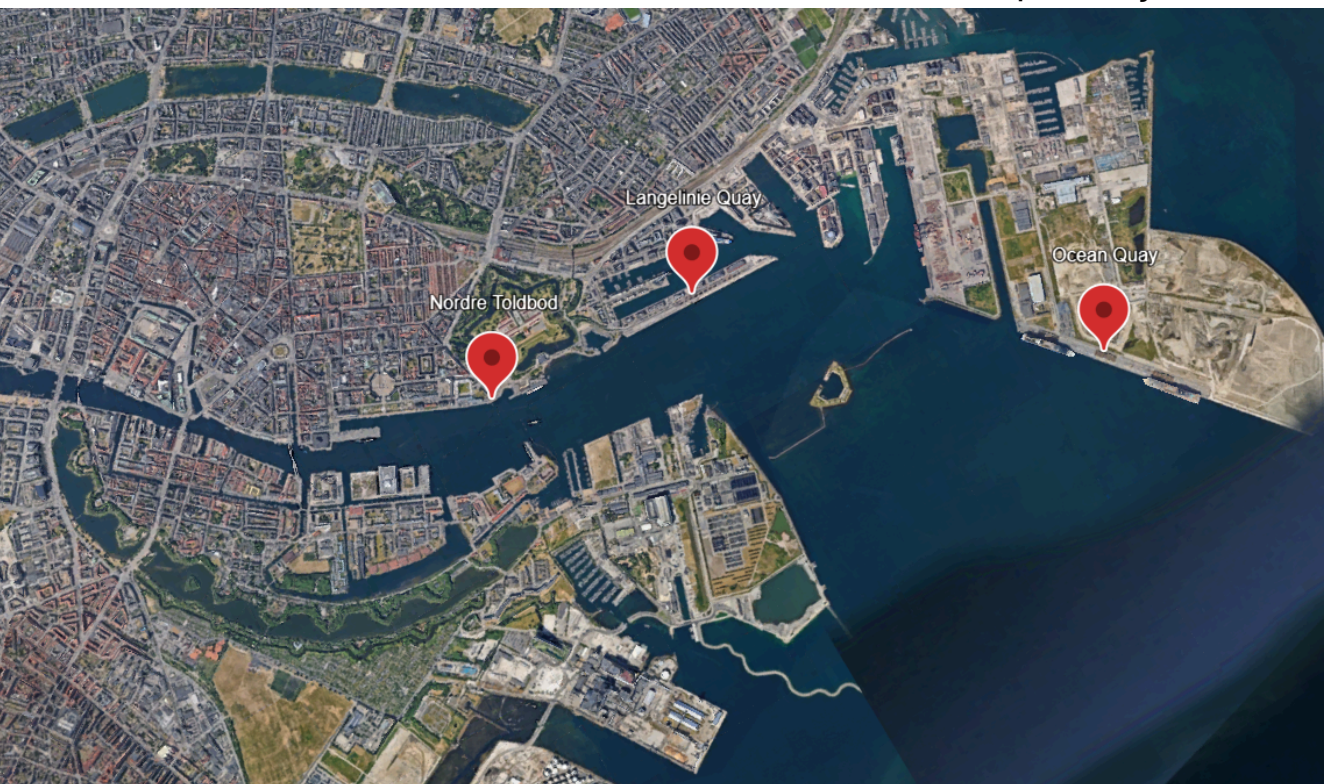
Copenhagen Cruise Terminals

Copenhagen has three main cruise terminals:

Ocean Quay - Main terminal with 3 berths

Langelinie - Historic terminal

Nordre Toldbod - Small ships only

Tivoli Gardens

A magical amusement park and pleasure garden, offering thrilling rides, beautiful gardens, and enchanting entertainment for all ages.



Rosenborg Castle

A stunning Renaissance castle, home to the Danish Crown Jewels and a fascinating collection of royal treasures.



Kronborg Castle

A majestic Renaissance castle, famous for its association with Shakespeare's Hamlet, offering guided tours and stunning views of the Øresund Sound.



Nyhavn

Nyhavn is Copenhagen's iconic waterfront district, famous for its colorful 17th and 18th-century townhouses, bars, cafes, and restaurants. Originally a busy commercial port, today it's a popular entertainment district and a perfect spot to experience Danish hygge. The canal is lined with historic wooden ships, adding to its maritime charm. This picturesque area is also known as the former home of famous Danish author Hans Christian Andersen.
