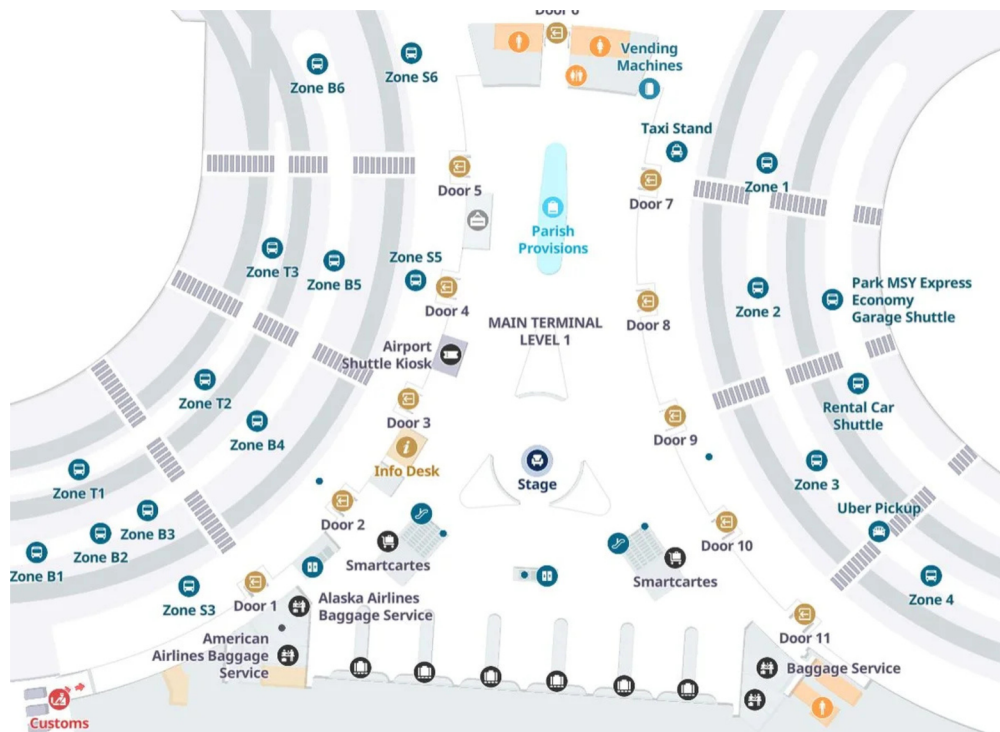




Cruising from New Orleans

Flying In

The primary airport you would be flying into will be the Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport. It is roughly 25 minutes from the cruise port. There is a good number of hotel rooms in close proximity to the airport as well as the port.



Find Your Ride

Once you reach the baggage claim area you are able to exit through door 7 to find the dedicated taxi pick up area. Fare will cost you \$36.00 from the airport to the Central Business District or the French Quarter. For rideshare pickup, outside of baggage claim in the middle curb is where they will be waiting for you. Shuttles will be waiting for you outside of baggage claim. Go through Doors 1-5 to find them.
