

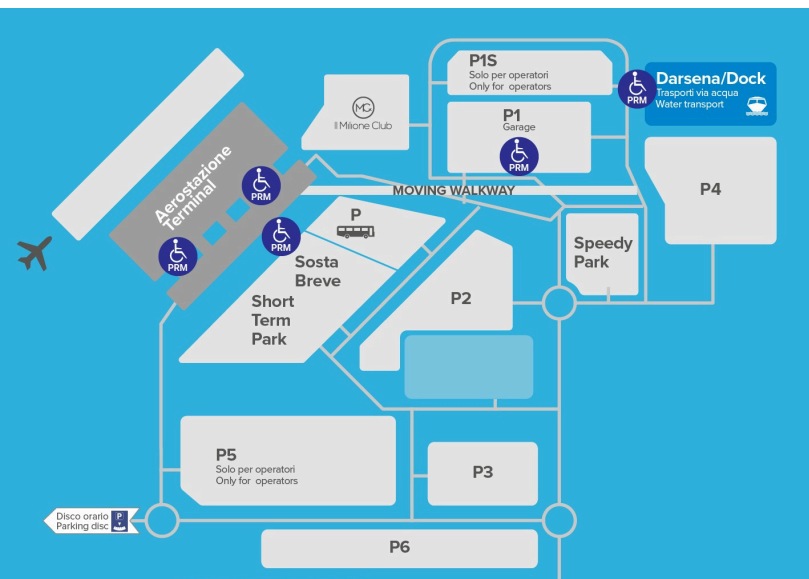


Cruising from Ravenna

Flying in

Venice Marco Polo Airport

Located approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes from Ravenna's cruise port, Venice Marco Polo Airport is one of the primary airports used for cruises departing Ravenna. The airport offers good connections to major European cities and is well-connected to the region by various transportation options.

Taxis

Pick up - outside Arrivals Hall

Approximate Fares:

180€ (\$195 USD) Airport to Ravenna Port

45€ (\$49 USD) Airport to Venice Piazzale Roma.

Bologna Guglielmo Marconi Airport

approximately 140€ (\$152 USD) to Ravenna

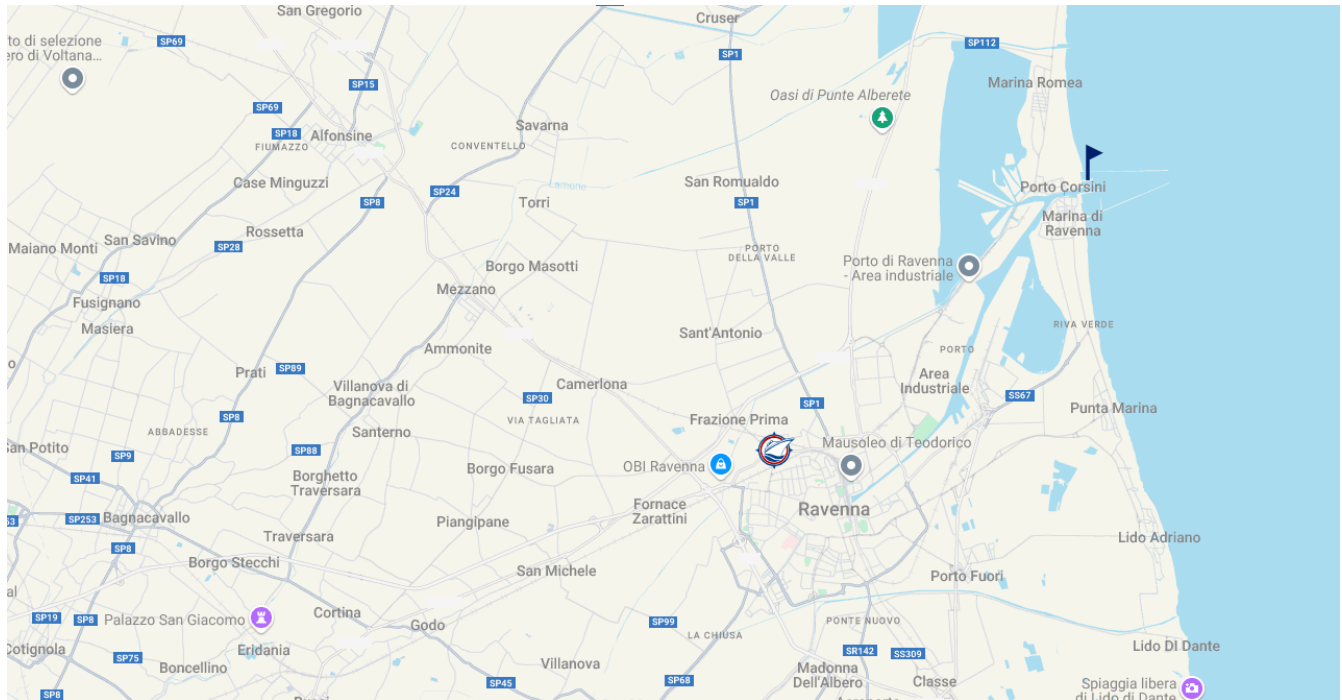
Rental Cars: All major companies present in terminal

Porto Corsini Terminal

The Porto Corsini Terminal in Ravenna is a modern facility handling cruise ships. Located approximately 12km from the city center, it offers parking facilities and basic amenities for cruise passengers. It features one terminal with two berths.

Venice

Venice, a city built on water, is a unique and romantic destination. Its labyrinthine canals, iconic gondolas, and stunning architecture, including St. Mark's Square and the Doge's Palace, create a magical atmosphere.



Italian Sports Car Museums

Dante's Tomb

Mausoleum of Theodoric

This unique UNESCO World Heritage site is the tomb of Theodoric the Great, king of the Ostrogoths. Built in 520 AD, it's remarkable for its distinctive architecture and massive single-stone dome. The mausoleum stands as a testament to the blend of Roman and Germanic cultural influences in Ravenna.
