Location

Close proximity to the port and Miami Beach.

Layout

Horseshoe design with a central road for easy navigation.

Transportation

Cruise transport, rideshares, and taxis readily available.

Access

Enter via I395, which becomes MacArthur Causeway. Use tunnel to reach Dodge Island.

2

Terminals

10 cruise line terminals with predictable placement, but can overlap during high traffic.

3

Entry

No ID required to enter port area.

Terminals AA/AAA

Owned and operated by MSC Cruises.

Terminal A

Owned and operated by Royal Caribbean.

Terminal G

Split between Royal Caribbean and Celebrity Cruises.



Norwegian and Carnival Terminals

Terminals B and C

Owned and operated by Norwegian Cruise Line (NCL).

Terminals D and E

Shared between Carnival, Holland America, and Seabourn.

Terminal F

Exclusive to Carnival Cruise Line.

Shared by luxury lines like Regent Seven Seas, Oceania, Crystal, and Azamara.



Terminal K

New terminal being built for Disney Cruise Line.

Owned and operated by Virgin Voyages.

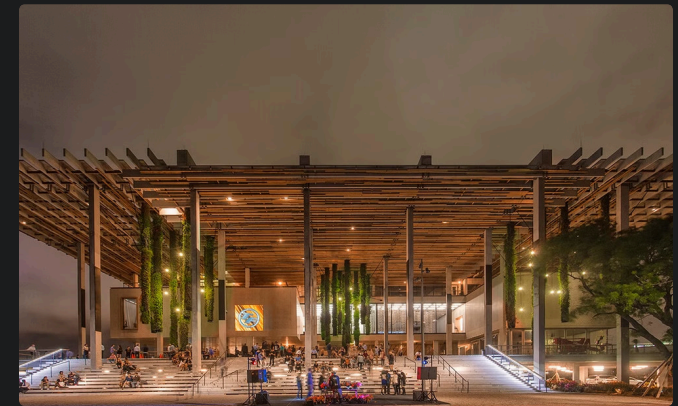
